## FIRST PLACE FEMALE BREAKS RACE RECORD BY 23 SECONDS AT THE SIXTEENTH ANNUAL GREAT BUFFALO CHASE 5K

Nearly \$16,000 to be donated to local V.F.W for city fireworks show

**FRANKFORT, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KY (July 12, 2017)** – Despite the rain this Fourth of July, another record was broken at Buffalo Trace Distillery's annual Great Buffalo Chase 5k, where the female record for best race time was broken by 23 seconds.

Mary Wacera was the first place female winner, with a time of 15 minutes and 26 seconds, which beat the women's record for best race time, and lands her in the ranking for number five in the world! Since Wacera broke the female record, she received a \$1,000 bonus, bringing her total race winnings to \$4,000.

Silas Kipruto was the first place men's winner, with a time of 14 minutes and three seconds. Kipruto received \$3,000 for his win.

The second place men's winner was John Muritu Wanjiku with a time of 14 minutes and six seconds, followed by third place men's winner Wilson Kibogo with a time of 14 minutes and eight seconds.

The second place women's winner was Monicah Ngige with a time of 15 minutes and 29 seconds, which puts her in the ranking for number six in the world! Ngige was followed by third place women's winner Emmaculate Chebet with a time of 16 minutes and nine seconds.

The second and third place winners for both sexes won \$2,500 and \$2,000 respectively.

One hundred percent of Buffalo Trace's Great Buffalo Chase 5K proceeds go to the Frankfort area VFW, post 4075, which they in turn use toward putting on the

fireworks show for the city of Frankfort. This year it is expected Buffalo Trace will donate somewhere around \$16,000 to the local VFW.

The certified race route winds though Buffalo Trace's scenic grounds where runners pass by centuries-old barrel aging warehouses on the National Historic Landmark site.

Prior to the race, Michael Preacely from the University of Kentucky School of Music sang the national anthem, and throughout the event, WKYT television news anchor Amber Philpott acted as the emcee.

After the race, an award ceremony was held for the top male and female runners as well as for each age group. Cash prizes and trophies were awarded to the top male and female runners, and trophies were giving to the top runners in each age group to commemorate their win.
